Maught & Others } This Cause standing ready for hearing, and being submitted
on Bill & answer without argument, The proceedings were read & considered;
and it appearing by the answers of the Defendants - That the Complainants
are entitled to the relief prayed, and the defendants willing that a Decree
should pass for sale of the Real Estate, in the proceedings mentioned. It
is thereupon this seventh day of January eighteen hundred and fifty four
adjudged, Ordered & Decreed That the Real Estate of which William Maught
did seize, and possessed be sold That Samuel Maught of Frederick County
be and he is hereby appointed to make such sale and that the course and
manner of his proceeding shall be as follows He shall first file with the Clerk
of this Court - a Bond to the State of Maryland, executed by himself, with sureties
to be approved by this Court, or the Clerk thereof, in the penalty, of Five thousand
dollars Conditioned for the faithful performance of the trust reposed in him by
this Decree or which may be reposed in him by any future, order or Decree in
the premises He shall then proceed to make sale of said Real Estate, having
first given at least three weeks notice inserted in some Newspaper printed in
Frederick Town, and such other notice, as he may think proper, of the time,
place manner, and terms of sale which terms shall be, One third Cash, on
the day of sale, and the residue in two Equal annual payments, with in
trust from the day of sale and to be secured by the notes of the purchaser
with sureties to be approved by the Trustee and as soon as may be - Conve-
