Whereas by a Decree of the Circuit Court for Frederick County sitting in Equity bearing date on the Twenty fourth day of September, in the year eighteen Hundred & fifty three, and passed in a cause in the said Court wherein David Gamble, and Richard Gilson are Complamants, and Elizabeth Getter, Joseph A. Getter & others are defendants, the above bound David Gamble, has been appointed Trustee to make sale of certain Real Estate, in the proceedings in said Cause mentioned.
