Skinner, who are Infants, under the age of Twenty one years, & are residents of Indebick County, in the State of Maryland, your Complainant charges, that the said Real Estate is susceptible of division among the parties aforesaid, and that if the same cannot be divided among them with advantage to all the parties, then that your Complainant will be entitled, to have the same sold, and the proceeds thereof distributed amongst the parties, in proportion to their respective Interests, your Complainant charges - That Mary Catharine Skinner, George W. B. Skinner & Cornelius M. Skinner, three of the heirs at Law of said Cornelius Skinner are Infants, under the age of Twenty one years, and incapable of making division of said Lands, and Tenements. To the end therefore - That Mary Phoebe Skinner, the widow of said Cornelius Skinner, and Mary Catharine Skinner, George W. Skinner, & Cornelius M.
