Whereas by a Decree of the Circuit Court for Frederick County sitting as a Court of Equity, dated on the first day of January, in the year eighteen hundred, and fifty five, and passed in a Cause in said Court pending, wherein Mary Phoebe Shiner was Complainant, and others were defendants, and Edward A. Shiner was Complainant - The above bound Edward A. Shiner was appointed Trustee to sell the Real Estate in the proceedings in the said Cause mentioned.
