



Exhibit N^o. 2. is in the words and figures following. Viz.
 Articles of agreement - made and entered into, this 3^d. day of January 1854 between Jacob Little of the One part, and Albert G. Mayberry of the other part, both of Frederick County in the State of Maryland, as follows. Viz. The said Little on his part for the Consideration herein after named hath Covenanted, and agreed to, and with the said Mayberry, and hath sold to him, the Two Story Brick House, with the ground & appurtenances, belonging to the same, Situate, lying, and being, on the West side of Market Street, in Frederick Town, & near the Bridge over Carroll Creek, and being the same property which was Conveyed to the said Jacob Little by Warner Kauffmann, and wife, by deed Recorded in the Clerks office of the County aforesaid - The Consideration sum to be paid, for said property, being two thousand Dollars, and to be paid as follows. Viz. One thousand Dollars, to be paid, on or before the first day of April next, and the Balance in two Notes of hand, each for the sum of Five hundred Dollars, payable in one & two years, after date, with Interest, said Notes to be dated on the first day of April 1854, and the Interest thereon to be paid Semi annually - and the said Little, on his part further Covenants, and agrees to give the said Mayberry, by his Complying with the Conditions of this agreement, full & entire possession of the aforesaid property, on the said first day of April next, and also, to make, execute & deliver to the said Mayberry his heirs, & assigns, a good & sufficient Deed, for said property, free from any, and all incumbrances, whenever the whole purchase money for the said property shall be paid by said Mayberry. And the said Albert G. Mayberry, on his part, Covenants & agrees to pay to said Jacob Little, his heirs & assigns as purchase money for the within named property, the sum of Two thousand Dollars, in like manner, and upon the Terms & Conditions as herein already set forth, and expressed, by the said Little, his heirs or assigns, Complying with the Terms, and Conditions of this agreement. 
