At the execution of the annexed Commission, issued out of the Circuit Court for Frederick County - sitting as a Court of Equity, and to me directed, and empowering me to examine Evidence in the Cause depending, in said Court - Between Thomas Staller as Complainant and Israel Mayberry, and Others as defendants. I the Commissioner therein named did on the fourth day of January, 1854, in Frederick Town, in Frederick County, having first taken the Oath annexed to said Commission, proceeded to take the following depositions, to wit:

Mary A Schleigh - a witness of lawful age, produced on the part of the Complainant, being duly sworn, and examined to Interrogatories filed with the Commissioner, by the Complainant, and hereunto returned, deposes, and says.

To the 1st Intg. That she knows all the parties to the Bill of Complaint, in the said Cause and has known them for a considerable length of time.

To the 2^d Interrogatory - That she knew Alfred Mayberry - He is dead - He died on the 5th day of May, 1854. That he left no children - That he left the following named Brothers & Sisters living at the time of his death, viz - Israel Mayberry, Rebecca Mayberry, Elizabeth Hally, this deponent, Sophia Mably, and Artemus Mayberry, and the following named Nieces and nephews, viz - Alfred Rutter, Mary A R. Hall, John Rutter, Susan V. Rutter, and Ellen Rutter, Children of Henrietta Rutter a deceased sister of said Alfred Mayberry. That said Israel Mayberry resided in the State of Virginia, said Sophia Mably resides in Washington County - in the State of Maryland - said Alfred Rutter resides in the State of Pennsylvania, said Mary A R. Hall, John Rutter, and Ellen Rutter, in Baltimore City, in the State of Maryland and all the rest of said aforementioned parties reside in Frederick County aforesaid, That - said Sophia Mably is intermarried with Ely Mably, and Mary A R. Hall is intermarried with John Hall, mentioned in said Bill. That all the rest of said named female parties are adults, except Susan V. Rutter, and said Ellen Rutter, who are Infants under the age of - twenty one years.

To third Interrogatory - That said Alfred Mayberry, did not leave personal property sufficient for the payment of his debts.

To the Fourth Interrogatory - That said Alfred Mayberry left a house, and Lot in Frederick - town which is only partially paid for.

George D Miller, also a witness of lawful age, and duly sworn, was then produced also on the part of the Complainant, and being examined to Interrogatories filed with - the Commissioner, by the Complainant, and hereunto returned, deposes and says -

To 1st Interrogatory - That he looks at Exhibit No. 2, filed in said Cause - That it is a true Copy of the agreement, entered into between Jacob Little, and said Albert Mayberry - That the last one thousand Dollars, (\$1000.) of the purchase money, mentioned in said agreement is yet unpaid.

To the Second Interrogatory - That he knew Jacob Little, that he is dead - That he died in July, 1854.

To 3^d Interrogatory - That said Jacob Little left as his heirs, at Law, Hannah A Kaufman, Christiana Miller, Mary A C. Little, and Comfort M. Little, they are all about the age of twenty one years, That Hannah A Kaufman - is intermarried with Warner Kaufman, mentioned in said will, and Christiana Miller is intermarried, with this deponent - That said Mary A C. ^{Little} Miller & Comfort M. Little, are intermarried - That said Hannah Ann Kaufman resides in the City of Baltimore, and the rest of said heirs of Jacob Little reside in Frederick County aforesaid.
