


it appearing to the Court that the Complainant is entitled to the relief prayed it is thereupon
this fifth day of February eighteen hundred and fifty five, adjudged, ordered & decreed, That the
Real Estate, in the proceedings mentioned be sold, That Michael Bromett be and he is of
Frederick County be, and he is hereby appointed Trustee to make such sale; and the course & man-
ner of his proceedings shall be as follows. He shall first file with the Clerk of this Court
a Bond to the State of Maryland, executed by himself with sureties to be approved by this
Court, in the penalty of four Thousand Dollars, conditioned for the faithful performance
of the trust reposed in him by this Decree, or which may be reposed in him by any future
Order, or Decree in the premises. He shall then proceed to make sale of said Real Estate
