

Thereupon the following Decree was passed:

Abraham Stoner. } N<sup>o</sup> 2502. In the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as  
 a Court of Equity, January Term 1855.

Margaret Hamburg. } This cause standing ready for hearing & being submitted,  
 David Hamburg & others. } to the Court without argument, upon the Bill, answers, exhibits, testimony, and all other proceedings, which were duly read & considered, It is thereupon this 16<sup>th</sup> day of January, 1855, by me Madison Nelson, Judge of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity, and by the authority of said Court, adjudged, ordered, and decreed, That unless the said defendants, or some one of them, shall on or before the 26<sup>th</sup> day of January, Instant pay or bring into this Court, to be paid, unto Abraham Stoner, the said Complainant, or his Solicitor, the sum of Forty Three dollars, with Interest thereon, from the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of August 1849, until paid - the sum of Five hundred dollars, with Interest from the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of August, 1849, until paid, the sum of Five hundred dollars, with Interest from the first day of August 1849, until paid, the sum of Fifty six dollars, with Interest thereon from the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of November 1848, until paid, less Ten dollars and sixty seven cents paid thereon, on the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of June 1849, and also pay as aforesaid the further sum of Ninety dollars, with Interest thereon from the 1<sup>st</sup> day of August 1849, until paid, Together with the Complainant's costs of this suit to be taxed by the Clerk of this Court, the Land premises & Real Estate specified & described in the proceedings in this cause, or so much thereof as may be necessary be sold as therein prayed, and that Grayson Eichelberger be, and he is hereby appointed Trustee to make said sale, and that the course & manner of his proceedings, shall be as follows. He shall first file with the Clerk of this Court, his Bond with approved Security, payable to the State of Maryland, in the penalty of fourteen hundred dollars, Conditioned for the faithful performance of the trust reposed in him - by this decree, a which may be reposed in him by any future order or decree in the premises - he shall then proceed to make sale of said Real Estate, having first given three weeks public notice, by advertisement inserted in some newspaper printed in Frederick and such other notice, as he may think proper, of the time, place, manner & terms of sale, which terms shall be as follow. One half of the purchase money to be paid on the day of sale, and the residue in six months, from the day of sale, and the purchaser shall give his note with approved Security, bearing Interest from the day of sale, for said deferred payments, and on the payment of the whole of the purchase money & not before - the Trustee shall by a good and valid deed of conveyance, to be executed & acknowledged, agreeably to law, convey to the purchaser, the property so purchased - by him, free, clear & discharged, from all claims of the parties, Complainant, and
