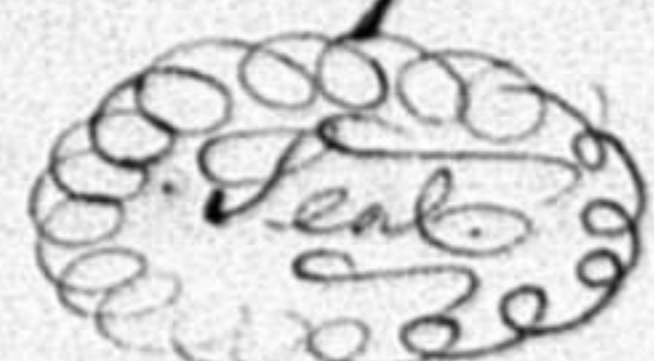


In Testimony whereof, I hereunto subscribe my name, and affix the seal of my office this 25<sup>th</sup> day of January, in the year of our Lord, eighteen hundred and Fifty five.

Thereupon the following decree was passed.

In the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity. No. 1182.

On reading the Petition of Lewis S. Kemp, Executor of Lewis Kemp, and Jacob Buckrey - administrator of Daniel Buckrey, and Simon C. Simmons, and the affidavit, marked A. and the certificates, marked respectively B. & C. accompanying the said Petition - It is thereupon this 27<sup>th</sup> day of January, 1855, by the Court adjudged & ordered that Samuel Tyler Esq. be and he is hereby appointed Trustee in the place, and stead of Lewis Kemp dec<sup>d</sup> the former Trustee, whose duty it shall be, after having filed his bond to the State of Maryland, with good security to be approved by this Court in the sum of Two thousand Dollars, Conditioned, for the faithful performance of the trust reposed in him by this Order, or which may be reposed in him by any future order or Decree in said Cause, to sell all the property if any, not already sold, by the former Trustees, in the same manner, and on the same Terms prescribed in the Decree in this Cause for the sale of the property, and that he report said sales to this Court, and to conform to said Decree in making & reporting said sales, and conveying the property sold to the purchaser, or purchasers.

It is further ordered, that the said Samuel Tyler, the Trustee now appointed by this Order, make report to this Court, as soon as convenient of the resale of the property made by Lewis Kemp, former Trustee to George Bear, in order that this Court may take such order thereon as to this Court may seem right, and proper. And it is further adjudged & ordered, and decreed that the said Lewis S. Kemp, Executor of Lewis Kemp, Trustee pay over to Samuel Tyler - the Trustee appointed, in the place of said Lewis Kemp dec<sup>d</sup>, or bring into this Court, for that purpose, on or before the first day Feb<sup>y</sup> next, the sum of Thirteen Hundred, and seventy nine dollars, and seventy cents (\$1379.70) the purchase money alleged by the Petition of the said Petitioner, and by the said Lewis S. Kemp Esq. as afo<sup>r</sup> to be in his hands, arising from sales, under the Decree in this Cause, the said money when so paid to the said Samuel Tyler, or brought into this Court, to be distributed, amongst the parties entitled thereto, according to the rules of this Court.

The following Bond was filed 31 Jan<sup>y</sup>, 1855. (Maryland Stamps \$1.)

Know all men by these presents, that we Samuel Tyler, William Tyler, & William Tyler Sr. all of Frederick County, and State of Maryland, are held, and firmly bound, unto the said State, in the sum of Two thousand Dollars, lawful money, to which payment well and truly to be made we bind our selves, our heirs & Executors, jointly & severally, firmly by these presents, sealed with our seals, and dated this Thirtieth day of January, 1855.

Whereas by a Decree of the Circuit Court, for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity passed on the 27<sup>th</sup> day of January, 1855, in Case 1182 on the Docket in said Court, the said Samuel Tyler, was appointed a Trustee, for the purposes set forth in said Decree as by reference to the same will more fully appear.

Now the Condition of the above obligation is such - that if the above bound Samuel Tyler - shall faithfully perform the trust reposed in him by said Decree, or Order, or which may hereafter be reposed in him by any future Decree, or Order in the premises, then the above obligation shall be null & void, otherwise the same shall remain in full force & virtue <sup>Law.</sup>
