May it please your Honor, to grant unto your orators & oratrices, an order of publication, giving notice unto said non residents, Emanuel Whip, Jacob Whip, George Coleman, and Joseph Coleman of the substance, and Object of this bill & warning them to appear in this Court, in person or by solicitor, on or before a certain day to answer the premises, and show cause if any they have why a Decree, ought not to pass as prayed - and may it please your Honor to grant unto your orators & oratrices, the writ of Subpoena, against James C. Casper & Elizabeth wife, Joseph S. Stuffer & Catharine his wife & John Ausherman of Frederick County, and also the writ of Subpoena against John Mullensore, Daniel Mullensore, Jacob Mullensore, William Easton, and Mary his wife of Washington County, Commanding them to appear in this Court at some certain day to be therein named to answer the premises, and abide by and perform such Decree as may be passed therein, and as in duty &c.

In the name of God amen. I George Cost of Frederick County in the State of Maryland being advanced in years, but of sound and disposing mind, memory & understanding Considering the certainty of death, and the uncertainty of the time thereof, and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs, and thereby be the better prepared to leave this world, when it shall please God to call me hence, do therefore make and publish this my last will and Testament, in manner & form following - that is to say. First, and principally - I Commit my soul into the hands of Almighty God & my body to the Earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my executors herein after named, and after my debts, and funeral charges are paid. I devise & bequeath - as follows. Item I give and devise to my son George Cost, the plantation whereon I now live, containing two hundred and twenty six acres, clear of all incumbrance, to him his heirs and assigns, in fee simple - It being included in the resurvey "called Cost's Content" which resurvey contains within its limits, fifty acres, which belongs to my wife, in fee simple, and ninety three acres I devised to my daughter Catharine Mullensore, also I give & devise to my said son George Cost, & my daughter Elizabeth Coleman in equal right my tract of land on the adjacent mountain, "called The Resurvey on Stickers Timberland" enlarged, containing sixty six acres, to be divided between them in equal value, share and share alike, to them and their heirs & assigns in fee simple. Item I give & devise to my two daughters, Catharine Mullensore, and Margaret Biser, in equal right, my other tract of mountain land "called High Mt" containing fifty eight & a half acres, to be divided between them, in equal value - share and share alike, to them and to their and assigns in fee simple.  
Item Whereas my wife, Mary Elizabeth Cost, holds in her own right, fifty acres of land - within the resurvey aforesaid, which land at her demise, or sooner I have understood from her she intends giving to our son George Cost, and in case my said wife should make the devise or gift of the said fifty acres of land to the said George as aforesaid - then I will and direct that my said son George Cost, shall pay to my daughters Mary and Margaret, eight hundred pounds current money - that is to say to each one of them four hundred pounds, and to my daughters Catharine, Elizabeth, and Margaret nine hundred pounds, current money, that is to say, to each one of them three hundred pounds.
