That George East Jr. left one child - Elizabeth, the wife of James C. Carper, who lives in Frederick County. That Uly Mullenore left four children viz. Daniel Mullenore, Jacob Mullenore, Mary the wife of Mr. Easton who live in Washington County, and Catharine the wife of Joseph S. Stuffer, who lives in Frederick County. That Mary Whip left four children viz. Emanuel Whip & Jacob Whip, who do not reside in the State of Maryland, and George S. Whip & Julied. Tobey, wife of Jonathan Tobey, who live in Frederick County. That Elizabeth Coleman left two children viz. George Coleman, who lives in Virginia, & Joseph Coleman, who lives in Ohio.
