Palmer of Frederick County & State of Maryland, are held and firmly bound unto the said state, in the just and full sum of Four thousand Dollars, current money to be paid to the said state, or its certain attorney, to which payment, well & truly to be made & done, we bind ourselves, and each of us, our and each of our heirs, ex-ecutors, and administrators, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents, sealed with our seals, and dated this 28th day of February, A.D. 1855.

Whereas by a Decree of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity, bearing date, on the 28th day of February, 1855, and passed in a cause in said Court pending between Sophia Troxel, as Complainant, and Joshua Motter, and others as-
defendants, being N^o 2536, on the Equity Docket of said Court, the said Grayson Eichelberger was appointed Trustee, and was authorized, and empowered to make sale of cer-
tain Real Estate in the proceedings, in said Cause mentioned.
