Struck his securities thereon, which said Note was made payable, Sixty days after date, the of, and is now held, and owned by your Complainants, by virtue of an indorsement made by said Lewis Ramsburg, and is still due, and unpaid, subject to certain credits indorsed thereon, all of which matters & things will fully appear from the said Note herewith filed, marked Exhibit A. which said Exhibit, together with all other Exhibits hereon after produced, and filed - your Complainants pray may be taken & considered as a part of this their Bill of Complaint, your Complainants further state that the said William Watson - departed this life intestate, in Frederick County in or about the month of August, eighteen hundred and fifty one, and that he died seized, and possessed of certain parcels of Real Estate, situate in said County, as will appear from the copy of the Dec^d. filed as Exhibit B. your Complainants further state, that letters of administration, upon the personal Estate of the said William Watson have been granted by the Orphans Court of Frederick County to Mary Watson, who has bonded, and entered upon the discharge of the duties as administratrix as will appear from an exemplification of the Letters granted & filed herewith - as Exhibit C. your Complainants further state - That the said William Watson left the following parties his heirs at Law, to wit: Martha Watson a sister, Elizabeth Fox, Jane Ann Kipper, married to John Kipper Isaac Watson a brother, all of whom are of full age of Twenty one years, and residents of Frederick County, Conrad Watson - a Brother, Daniel Watson - a brother, and Ephraim Watson a brother whose places of residence, and whether they are living or dead, are unknown, Mary Hamilton a sister - now dead, leaving two children, Catharine Hamilton and Susan Hamilton, Harriet Banks, a sister, now dead, leaving four children Elizabeth Banks, Thomas Banks, - Isaac Banks - the name of the fourth child
