




State of Maryland, Frederick County to wit: I Be it remembered & it is hereby certified - That on this 11th day of March, in the year, 1850, before the subscribers, two Justices of the peace of the State of Maryland, in and for Frederick County aforesaid, personally appeared John Weller, and Deborah Weller, his wife, and James Creager, they being known to us by our own personal knowledge, to be the persons, who are named and described as, and professing to be the parties to the foregoing deed, or Indenture and do severally acknowledge the said Indenture, or Instrument of writing, to be their respective act & deed, the said Deborah Weller, having signed & sealed the said Indenture before us, out of the presence, and hearing of her husband, and the said Deborah Weller being by us examined, out of the presence and hearing of her said husband, whether she doth execute & acknowledge the same, freely, and voluntarily, & without being induced to do so, by fear or threats of, or ill usage by her husband, or by fear of his displeasure" declareth and saith that she doth.

Creager, Sarah Creager, Joseph Creager, Charles Creager, Josephine Creager, & Martha Creager, of Frederick County, Greeting, you are hereby Commanded - that all excuses set apart you personally appear before the Judge of the Circuit Court, for Frederick County sitting as a Court of Equity, to be held at the Court House, in Frederick Town in and for said County, on the 3^d Monday of October next, to answer the bill and Complaint of John F. Creager, & others, by their next friends, Frederick Weller, against you in our said Court, exhibited & forth.
