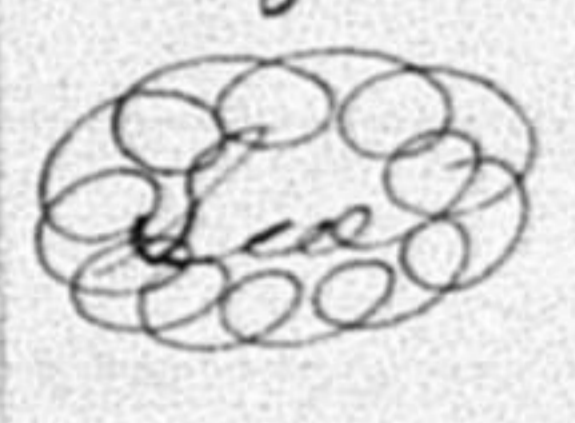


Be it remembered - that on this 9th day of December, in the year 1852, before the Subscribers, two Justices of the peace of the State of Maryland, in and for Frederick County personally appeared George Stever, & Amy his wife & acknowledged the foregoing deed, or Instrument of writing, to be their act & deed, and the said Amy wife of said George Stever have signed & sealed said deed, or Instrument of writing, in our presence, & out of the presence & hearing of her husband, and being by us privately examined, out of the presence & hearing of her said husband "whether she doth execute, & acknowledge the same freely & voluntarily and without being induced to do so by fear or threats of, or ill usage by her husband - or by fear of his displeasure, declareth and faith that she doth, and we do hereby Certify - that we are satisfied of our own personal knowledge, that the persons acknowledging as aforesaid, are the persons who are named & described as & professing to be the party grantors, in and to said deed, or Instrument of writing.

The following Petition & Order was filed Nov. 2^d 1854.

To the Hon. Mason Nelson, Judge of the Circuit Court, for Frederick County, sitting in Equity. The Petition of Michael F. Eichelberger, John Seabrooks & Mary M. Seabrooks his wife - Show. That on the 6th day of October, 1854 in Conjunction with Harriet A. Eichelberger, they filed their Bill, in your Honorable Court against Elizabeth Eichelberger, and others, being N^o 2579 Equity in said Court for partition, or sale of certain Real Estate therein specified - That since the filing of said Bill - Harriet A. Eichelberger, has departed this life. Intestate, without issue, and that her Interest in said Real Estate has descended to, and vested in her brothers, and sisters therein named, surviving her, May it therefore please your Honor, to pass an Order, authorising your petitioners to prosecute said Cause in Equity, as if said Harriet A. Eichelberger had not died, and between the surviving parties &c.
