



Came the within named Henry Getzendanner, before us the subscribers, two of the Justices of the Peace for said County, and acknowledged the foregoing Instrument of writing to be his act & deed, and the part of a Lot, or portion of ground, and premises, thereby granted, to be the right, and estate of the within named Anthony Brenner, his heirs and assigns forever, according to the true intent, and meaning of the foregoing deed, and the act of assembly, in such case made, and provided, and at the same time Hannah Getzendanner wife of him the said Henry Getzendanner, who being privately examined by us apart from & out of the hearing of her said husband did relinquish all her right of dowers of, and to the within named piece of a Lot, or portion of ground, and premises, and declares that she did the same of her own free will, without threats, or Compulsion from her said husband, or through fear of his displeasure.

Brenner & Henrietta Brenner of Frederick County Greeting - you are hereby Comanded  that all excuses set apart, you personally appear before the Judge, of the Circuit Court, for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity, to be held at the Court House, in Frederick Town - in and for said County, on the first Monday of July next, to answer the Bill and
