

what he supposed would be sufficient for payment of the debts; That said funds have been brought into Court, & under the order of said court have been distributed; But that the same have been found insufficient for payment of all said debts, all of which will appear by reference to the proceedings in No. 2355 Equity on the Docket of this Court. - Your petitioner further shews that the devisees of said Richard Johnson under the impression that said M. Keefer had sold sufficient property for payment of debts, filed the bill in this case for distribution among the said devisees; That Col. Thomas Johnson was appointed trustee to sell & has sold portions of said property & reported the same to this Court & that the case has been referred to the auditor. - Your petitioner therefore prays your Honor to pass an order directing the auditor, before distributing any of the proceeds of sale in this case among the devisees aforesaid, to allow all the balances due your petitioner & other creditors of said Richard Johnson, as evidenced by the claims filed in No. 2355 Equity.
