Now the condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound Grayson Eichelbenger - do and shall well & faithfully discharge the duties of Trustee, reposed in him by the above recited Decree, or which may be reposed in him by any future Decree or order in the premises then the above obligation to be void, otherwise to remain in full force & virtue in law.

Whereas the above bound Jonas Matthews and John Eyles feel themselves aggrieved by a Decree, passed on the 23<sup>d</sup> day of May Inst. 1854 by the Honorable Frederick A. Schley, Special Judge of the Circuit Court for Frederick County sitting in Equity in the Cause No. 2023 on the Docket of said Court, and are about to prosecute an appeal -
