

Conveyed to me by Jacob Myers for twenty seven acres. & three eighths of an acre of Land, more or less, and all that piece or parcel of Land, being part of a Tract of Land, called "Puzzlesome Corrected" which was on or about the 5th day of April 1810. Conveyed to me by Solomon Staley - for twenty & a half acres, of Land, more or less, and after the expiration of the term of two years, or at the time of the death of Charlotte, if that should happen before the two years expired, then and in either case - I give and devise the aforesaid twenty seven, and three eighths acres of Land, part of "Shuerstat" and the twenty & a half acres part of Puzzlesome Corrected to my Brother Jacob Myers, and Ann Mary - Ball, wife of Jacob Ball my sister for the term of five years, they in that time to put up eighty paces of Post & Railing fence, on the part of a Tract of Land called "Shuerstat" where the Rails now lay, and should there not be rails enough - they are to be cut, the number which may be deficient on the track, called "Puzzlesome Corrected, and should there not be posts enough in the yard they to buy the remainder, they are also to lease the yard and pass in front of the yards with bins, they are to cut down no wood, but to use the fallen & dead timber, and after the expiration of the said five years, I give & devise the aforesaid twenty seven & three eighths acres of Land, part of "Shuerstat" and the twenty & a half acres, part of Puzzlesome Corrected to my Aired Mary the eldest daughter of my brother Jacob, to her & her heirs & assigns forever. I also give and devise to my sister Charlotte, for & during her natural life, all that piece, or parcel of Land, situate in the County aforesaid, being part of a tract of Land called "Mundock's Fancy" which was on or about the eighteenth day of October 1817. Conveyed by Richard Potts and Ann Potts his wife to William Birely, for forty five & a half acres of Land, it being part of the said William Birely's estate, devised to me by his last will & Testament, bearing date on or about the second day of November 1821, and after the death of my sister - Charlotte - I give and devise the said forty five & a half acres, part of "Mundock's Fancy" to all the children of the said Charlotte, their heirs & assigns forever to be equally divided amongst them share and share alike.

I also give, and devise to my sister Charlotte, during her natural life, all that Western one half of the lot of grounds, in Frederick Town designated by Lot No. 342, and after her death - I give and devise the same to her son - William Birely, his heirs & assigns forever. Now I give & devise to my brother Jacob Myers, and my sister Charlotte Birely, all that piece, or parcel of Land, situate in the County aforesaid, being part of a Tract of Land called "Puzzlesome Corrected", which was on or about the fifteenth day of March 1820 conveyed by Jacob Staley for me for twenty eight acres of Land more or less, to be equally divided by a line cut across said Land, and that the Western part thereof, or that part next to Dr. William Sykes land shall be allotted to Jacob Myers, and his heirs & assigns forever, and that the Southern part of said Land shall be allotted to Charlotte Birely, her heirs & assigns forever. Item, I give and devise to my dear and respected mother Ann Margaret Myers, during her natural life, all that Southern one half of the Lot of grounds, and premises in Frederick Town, designated by Lot No. 342, with all the appurtenances thereto belonging - except the Weavers Shop, which shall be removed by my executors directed, and after the death of my mother I give and devise to my brother Jacob Myers, and my sister Ann Mary, wife of Jacob Ball, the said part of Lot No. 342, so devised to my mother, to them the said Jacob & Ann Mary, and their heirs and assigns forever, to be equally divided -
