This Indenture made this twenty seventh day of November, in the year eighteen hundred and fifty five, between William Edwards Smith of Frederick County Maryland of the one part; and John J. Smith of Frederick Town in said County & state of the other part; Witnesses that for and in Consideration of the sum of five hundred & fifty dollars, current money by the said John J. Smith to the said William E. Smith, in hand paid, at and before the sealing & delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said William E. Smith - hath bargained and sold, aliened, & conveyed, and by these presents, doth give grant bargain & sell, alien, convey, release, Convey & Confirm, unto the said John J. Smith his heirs, & assigns, all the right title interest, and Estate of him the said William E. Smith - being an undivided equal fourth part of, in & to those two pieces, parcels, or parts of Tracts of Land - the one being part of a Tract of Land, called "Shicrestal" being part of Darters Chance; which was on, or about the twentieth of January, 1821. Conveyed to John Myers, by Jacob Myers, for twenty seven and three eighth acres, of Land, more or less - the other being part of a Tract of Land called "Puzzlesome Corrected" which was on, or about the 5th of April 1810. Conveyed to the said John Myers by Solomon Staley, for twenty & a half acres of Land more or less. the foregoing parts of Tracts also the same devised in remainder in fee by said John Myers, to his niece Mary the eldest daughter of Jacob Myers, to her and her heirs & assigns forever, by his will dated the seventeenth of January, eighteen hundred and twenty four & duly recorded in the office of the Register of wills, for Frederick County. To Have & to Hold the said undivided Equal fourth part of said pieces, parcels or parts of Tracts of Land aforesaid, unto the said John J. Smith, his heirs & assigns forever, to his & their own proper use & behoof forever.
