

in the Court here. sitting as a Court of Equity by Bradley, J. Johnson, Esquire - Solicitor, and filed in Court here the following Bill of Complaint. & Exhibits. viz.

To the Honorable M. Nelson, Judge of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting in Equity. The Bill of Complaint of Samuel Wolfe, humbly shows, to your Honor, that John D. Forrest, and David A. Forrest, were indebted to your orator in the sum of one hundred & ninety five dollars, being the sum paid by your orator as surety for said John D. and David A. on a single bill given by them & your orator to one John Duggard, as will appear by said single bill, herewith exhibited, as exhibit A, which with all others, your orator prays may be taken as part of this his bill of Complaint. That said John & David, were seized of a Tract of Land, in said County "called" part of Three Mill Souls" containing 52 1/2 acres, more or less, as will appear by a Copy of said Deed herewith exhibited as Exhibit B. That the said John D. Forrest died intestate, in the year 1852, and that he left a widow Mary Anne Forrest, and Celestia Ann an Infant daughter, and that David A. Forrest, died about the year 1852, leaving a widow Lavinia Forrest, and David a minor son. That administration of the personal Estate of David A. Forrest, was granted to your orator by the Orphans Court, of Frederick County, and that administration of the personal effects of John D. Forrest, was granted by said Court to Solomon Forrest, as will appear by exemplification of said letters of administration, herewith exhibited, marked exhibit C. Your orator further charges that he has received on his said Debt, the sum of Eighty five dollars & Ninety three Cents from the personal property of John D. Forrest, and he also charges that the personal property of said Intestate is insufficient to pay their Debts, and he is advised, that he is thereby entitled, with such other creditors whose Claims have not yet been satisfied, to have them paid, out of said Real Estate. To the end therefore that the Defendants, hereinafter named may answer the several matters, and things herein alleged & charged as fully & particularly as if they were thereunto interrogated, and that the said Real Estate of said deceased intestate, or so much thereof as may be necessary, may be sold for payment of the claims of your orator & others, and that your orator may have such further fuller relief, in the premises, as Equity may require, may it please your Honor to grant, unto your orator, the writ of Subpoena against the said Solomon Forrest, administrator of John D. Forrest, Mary Anne Forrest, Lavinia Forrest, & David & Celestia Ann Forrest, Commanding them to be, and appear in this Court, at some day to be therein named to answer the premises & obey by, and perform such Decree as may be passed thereon and as in duty bound &c.
