These defendants further admit that George Feiler after the death of his father made his will, and after certain specific legacies and bequests directed to John Brungle his executor - to sell the rest of his estate, and devised the proceeds of sale to his three children, Henry Feiler, Catharine, the wife of Nicholas Lease, and Harriet, the wife of Ezra Doll, and they further admit - that exhibit N^o 4, in said bill is a true Copy of the will of Henry Feiler, and that exhibit N^o 5, is a true Copy of the will of George Feiler - That John Brungle died without executing the will of said George Feiler. They further admit, that Henry son of George Feiler died after his father, without issue, leaving a widow Eleanor Feiler who is still living, in Frederick County. That Catharine survived her husband - Nicholas Lease, and afterwards married John D. Hummel, and died, leaving her husband John D. Hummel, and George St. Lease. Harriet now widow of a man named Blagrow, Edward Lease, and Edward Lease, children by her first husband Nicholas Lease, and Catharine Hummel, Jacob Hummel, and John Hummel children of her last husband John D. Hummel, her surviving - all of whom are of full age, except John Hummel, who is an infant, under the age of Twenty one years. That Harriet the wife of Ezra Doll, survived her husband, and is now living in Frederick County. These defendants further admit, that Elizabeth Brungle daughter and devisee of said Henry Feiler died some years ago, leaving the following - children - Lawrence J. Brungle, Eve Margaret married to Edward Schley and Ann M. married to George Engelbight all of full age, and residents of Frederick County, and the following grand children - John W. Robert, Virginia, and Fanny Brungle, children of her son Daniel Brungle dec^d. her heirs at law, all of which grand children were under the age of Twenty one years. These defendants further admit - that Margaret Harman the devisee for life, died in the month of March Eighteen hundred & fifty six leaving a widow daughter Anna, now wife of Godfrey Root, and Margaret now wife of Wilson W. Kell, her heirs at law - all of whom are adults and reside in Frederick County.

These defendants admit that they, and the other parties mentioned in said Bill of Complaint, hold the said lands as tenants in Common, and that the interest, and advantage of all parties, Infants as well as adults requires that the same should be sold, under a decree of this Court, and the proceeds of sale distributed among the parties entitled to the same according to their respective proportions thereof. And these defendants, agree that such decree may be passed in the premises, as to the Court may seem right, and equitable, and pray hence to be dismissed, &c.
