

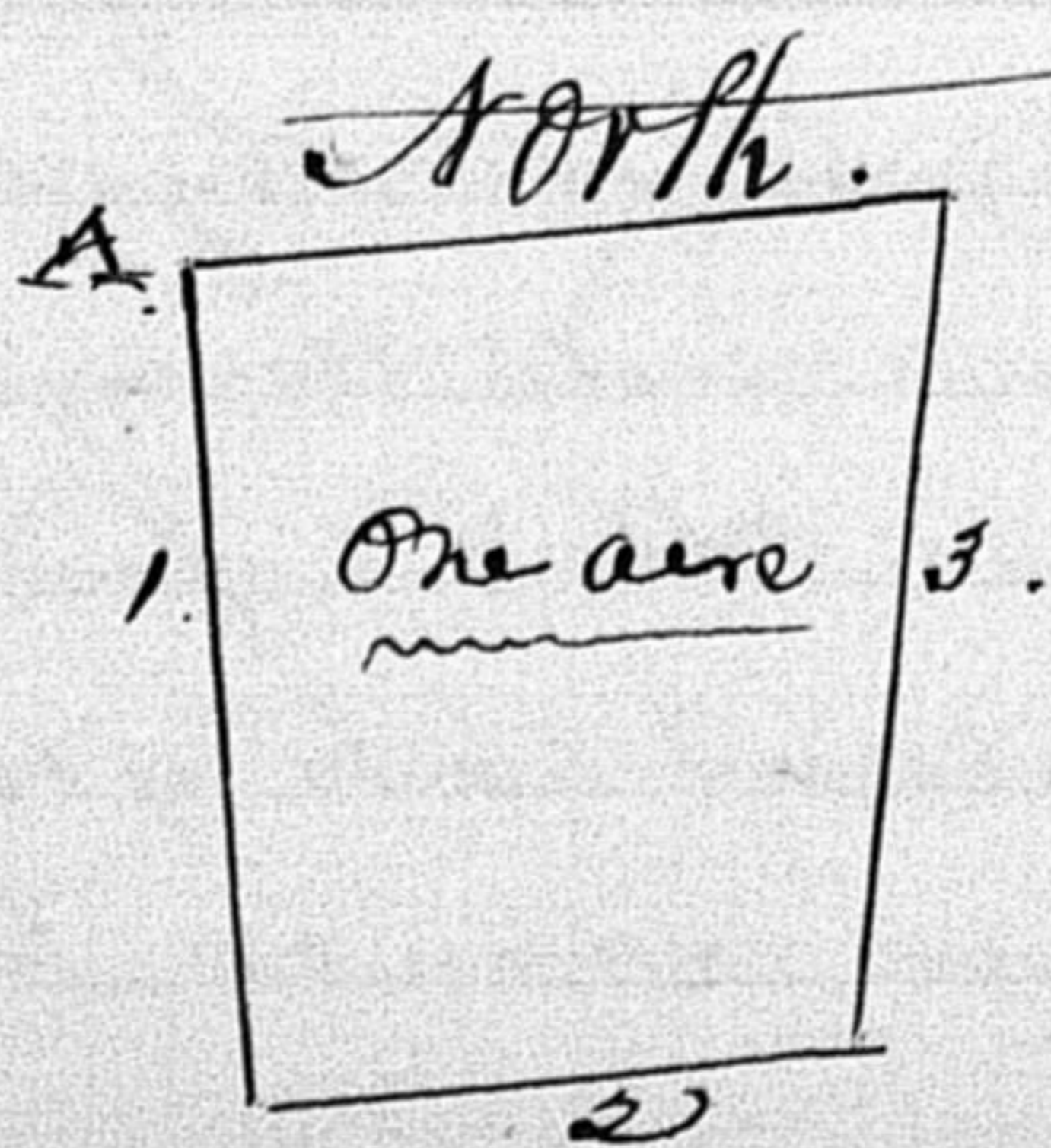

Exhibit A. is in the words & figures following viz.
The State of Maryland, to all persons, to whom these presents shall come Greeting: Knowye that whereas Philip Yeast, of Frederick County had Surveyed, & laid out for him, a Tract, or parcel of Land - Called "Bald Eagle Nob" lying in the County aforesaid, & containing Thirteen acres, by virtue of a common warrant, for the quantity, obtained by him, the fiftenth day of May 1797, as appears, and he having fully Compounded for said Land, according to law, The State of Maryland doth therefore hereby grant, unto him the said Philip Yeast, the said tract, or parcel of Land, called "Bald Eagle Nob", lying in Frederick County aforesaid, Beginning at a bounded white Oak tree, and running thence N. 24° E 8 ps. to a red Oak, marked with six Notches N. 59° E. 40 ps. S. 72° E. 16 ps. N. 29° E. 16 ps. to a white Oak with nine notches N. 62° W. 14 ps. N. 6° W. 24 ps. to a marked Red Oak N. 69° W. 16 ps. S. 27° W. 29 ps. 82° W. 20 ps. then by a straight line to the first beginning, containing Thirteen acres, according to the certificate of Survey thereof, Taken, & returned unto the Western Shore Land office, bearing date the 22^d day of May, 1797, and there remaining, together with all rights, profits, benefits & privileges thereto belonging, To Have & To Hold the same, unto him the said Philip Yeast, his heirs, and assigns forever.
