20th Int. That the land of which deponent has spoken as occupied by Daniel Stone, at the time of his death. deponent does not think susceptible of division amongst his heirs. but thinks it would be much to the advantage of those entitled to it. to have it sold. and the proceeds divided from the manner in which the land lies, it is not susceptible of division.

21st Int That deponent know nothing as to the enquiry therein contained
22nd Int That deponent does not. There being no other witnesses - to be examined at that time, and the solicitor for complainants desiring further time for the production of his evidences, the Commissioner held the said Commission open, until the 13th day of August 1856 when no other witnesses being produced & no further time being desired the Commissioner after having received as a part of the testimony taken. under said Commission, exhibits A & N. 1 & 2 filed in this cause - closed the said Commission & herewith returns the same together with said exhibits. under his hand & seal this 12th day of August 1856.
