The Petition of Sarah Kuhn the widow of Joseph Kuhn, late of said County

doe Respectfully sheweth unto your Honor that the said Joseph Kuhn her late husband to whom she lawfully married some time during the year 1850, died intestate, who died seized & possessed of the Land and premises specified in the aforesaid Bill of Complaint filed in your Honorable Court for the sale of said Real Estate, of which your petitioner dies seized, for the benefit of her heirs at Law: That the said Joseph Kuhn, died leaving, heirs at Law as stated & set forth, in said Bill of Complaint, your Petitioner states, and gives your Honor to understand, that she is advised, that she is entitled to one third of said real Estate, as her dower right, and that she is entitled to have her right of dower assigned and laid off to her by Commissioners to be appointed for that purpose, and that the said heirs at Law of the said Joseph Kuhn, and children of your petitioner are willing, and wish her dower right to be assigned & laid off to her your Petitioner states further - that she is of opinion that the said lands, and Real Estate, will not admit of a division amongst said heirs at Law: but that it would be for their interest, and advantage to have said lands & premises sold as prayed your Petitioner refuses, and does not elect to have said Real Estate sold free and clear &c. of her right of dower, but insists, that her dower be assigned & laid off to her by Commissioners to be appointed by your Honor &c. May it please your Honor, to order, as judge & decree - That a Commission issue out of this Honorable Court to five Commissioners, suitable and proper to assign lay off and designate the one third part of said premises, as aforesaid specified, as & for the dower of the said Petitioner in the same, which in duty bound your Petitioner will ever pray &c.
