

This case being submitted to the Court upon the Petition of the said Sarah Kuhn, the widow of said Joseph Kuhn (dec'd) and all the other proceedings in said case, of which said petition is a part and being satisfied that the Petitioner is entitled to relief, and to the end that the Court will be enabled to make a just assignment to the petitioner of her dower in the aforesaid specified Land & Tenements It is ordered and adjudged that a Commission issue to George W. Freeman Henry Ringer Williams Deftos. John B. Gilbert and Godfrey J. Seymour of said County, authorizing them, or any three of them, to go upon, survey lay off, and designate one third part of the said land, and premises, of which the said Joseph Kuhn died seized as and for the dower of the said Petitioner on the same - and the said Commissioners be directed in the said Commission to make out a plat & certificate, exhibiting an accurate description of the third part, or dower as by them laid off, and the said Commissioners shall make return of their proceedings to this Court as soon as may be, subject to its further order upon the same, and to the said Commission there shall be annexed the usual oath of office

Henry, and Margaret his wife & William Kuhn N. 2635 Equity, in the Circuit Court, for Frederick County, setting as a part of Equity. This defendant states for answer to said Bill of Complaint as to so much thereof as is material for her to make answer unto that she admits that the said Joseph Kuhn (dec'd) her late husband is dead, and that he died, leaving the Real Estate as stated & specified in said bill, and that he died leaving the children, as his heirs at law This defendant states for answer - that she claims to be entitled to dower in said Real Estate, specified in said bill, and that she is willing that said Real Estate, of which the said Joseph Kuhn died seized should be sold, subject to her dower right, and that she insists that her right of dower should be assigned, and laid off to her in said Real Estate, This defendant states further for answer that she is of opinion that the said Real Estate of which her late husband died seized will not admit of a division without injury amongst the said heirs at law, and that it would be for their interest, and advantage to have said Real Estate sold as prayed, but that she insists that her dower right shall be laid off, and that said Real Estate shall be sold subject to her right of dower.
