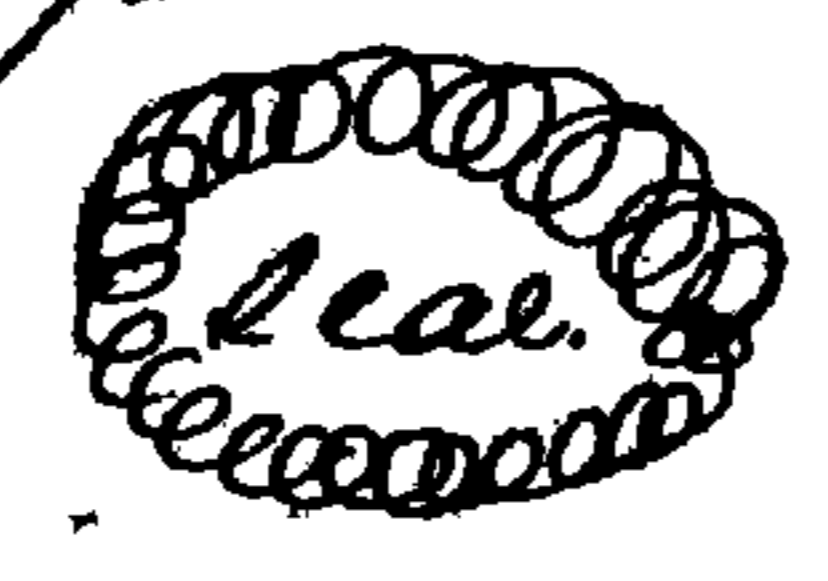


Maryland, Frederick County Set On the 28th day of March 1829 appears Neal McCallian party grantor to the within or foregoing instrument of writing, before us two Justices of the peace for said county, and acknowledges the same to be his act and deed, and the land & premises therein described, to be the right & estate of Henry McHenry his heirs & assigns forever, according to the true tenor & effect thereof, at the same time Catharine the wife of the said Neal McCallian being by us privately examined apart from her husband & out of his hearing, and acknowledges that she executed the said deed, and made her acknowledgement freely & voluntarily without being induced thereto by fear or threats of, or ill will or usage from her said husband, or from fear of his displeasure, & the acts of Assembly in such case made & provided. At the request of Henry McHenry the following Deed is recorded the 9th day of May 1836.

This Indenture made this fifteenth day of April 1836, between George Hahn of Frederick County in the State of Maryland, of the one part, and Henry McHenry of the county & state aforesaid, of the other part Witnesseth, that for and in consideration of the sum of Fifty dollars current money, by the said Henry McHenry to the said George Hahn in hand paid, at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt of which he doth here by acknowledge, and himself to be therewith fully satisfied, contented and paid, the said George Hahn hath bargained and sold, aliened, conveyed, and by these presents doth give grant bargain and sell, alien, convey, release, convey and confirm, unto the said Henry McHenry his heirs and assigns, All that part of a tract of land called "The Mountain Tract" that Jacob Miller of Jacob, sold to to John Willhides. Beginning for said part at the end of the third line of said John Willhides part, as aforesaid, and running north the fourth line of said Willhides part as aforesaid, North 83 deg West 21 ps, still with said part of said land South 35 deg W. 36 ps then S 83 deg E 58 ps until it intersects the third line of said John Willhides part of said land at the end of 51 perches, then with said line S. 72 deg E 35 ps to the first beginning, containing nine acres & 90 perches of land, more or less together with all and singular the buildings, improvements, ways, waters, water courses, rights members, privileges, advantages and appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining, and all the estate, right, title and interest, trust property, claim and demand, whatsoever at law and in equity of him the said George Hahn of in and to the same. To Have and to Hold the said part of a tract or parcel of land and premises, with the appurtenances thereto belonging, unto the said Henry McHenry his heirs and assigns, to the only proper use of the said Henry McHenry his heirs and assigns forever: And the said George Hahn for himself and his heirs doth hereby covenant, promise, and agree, to and with the said Henry McHenry his heirs and assigns, that he the said George Hahn his heirs, and all persons claiming under them, shall and will from time to time, and at all times hereafter, at the reasonable request, cost and charge of the said Henry McHenry or any of his heirs or assigns, make and lawfully execute, acknowledge and deliver, all and every such
