No. 1 This Indenture, made this seventeenth day of April in the year of our Lord, eighteen hundred and thirty, Between George Schlofer of Frederick County, and State of Maryland of the one part, and Thomas Burch of the County and State aforesaid of the other part; Witnesseth that the said George Schlofer for and in consideration of the sum of forty five dollars current money to him in hand paid or secured to be paid by the said Thomas Burch before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof he the said George Schlofer doth hereby acknowledge hath granted, bargained, sold, aliened, enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain, sell, alien, enfeoff and confirm unto the said Thomas Burch, his heirs and assigns forever, the following described lots of ground or pieces of land situate lying and being in Lewistown in Frederick County, State of Maryland, known and distinguished on the General Plan of said town by Number 100, 101, 102, 128, 129 and 130, reference may be had to a deed from John Wood to the aforesaid George Schlofer and dated the ninth day of March eighteen hundred and thirty will more fully and at large appear, said town was laid out by a certain Daniel Humberburg on a tract of land composed of parts of "Coopers Point, Miller's Chance and Caspell's Desire," Together with all and singular, the improvements, rights, members and appurtenances whatsoever to the lots of ground or pieces of land and premises thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining and all the estate, right, title, property, interest, benefit, claim and demand whatsoever in law and in Equity of him the said George Schlofer of, in and to the said within described lots of ground or pieces of land and premises and every part thereof, To have and to hold the said lots of ground or pieces herein and hereby granted, bargained and sold, meant, mentioned or intended to be and premises with the appurtenances and every part thereof unto the said Thomas Burch his heirs and assigns forever, and the said
