The object of this suit is to obtain a decree for
 the sale of the real estate whereof Peter M^cGee late of Frederick County died
 seized and possessed, for the purpose of partition among his heirs, The bill states
 that Peter M^cGee died intestate in the month of July eighteen hundred and
 fifty five, seized and possessed of certain lands situate in Frederick and
 Montgomery Counties, State of Maryland containing four hundred acres of land,
 more or less. That said lands descended to Mary M^cDermott a sister of the
 intestate now wife of John M^cDermott, and to James W. M^cGee, Joseph M^cGee,
 John M^cGee, Elizabeth M^cGee, Catharine M^cGee, Martha M^cGee and Cecelia M^cGee
 children of Hugh M^cGee, deceased, a brother of said intestate, and who died
 before him, and to James M^cGee and Elizabeth M^cGee, children of Patrick M^cGee,
 deceased, a brother of said intestate and who died before him. That Eliza-
 beth M^cGee, and Catharine M^cGee have married persons, whose names are
 unknown to the complainants and who reside with their husbands in the State
 of Pennsylvania, That all the heirs except Cecelia M^cGee, James M^cGee and
 Elizabeth M^cGee (who are infants under the age of twenty one) are of full age
 and residents of the State of Maryland - The bill further states, that the
 lands and premises whereof Peter M^cGee died seized and possessed, are not
 susceptible of division among the parties interested, And that the interest and
 advantage of all parties concerned, infants as well as adults requires, that the same
