

D^r Lloyd Dorsey, He is dead, he died sometime in September 1856. I look at the paper here shown me marked Exhibit N^o 2, It does embrace the real estate of which said Lloyd Dorsey died seized and possessed. To the 3^d Interrogatory, D^r Lloyd Dorsey died leaving a widow and six children, The widow's name is Rebecca Ann Law Dorsey, The names of the children are Virginia Torrence, Nicholas James, Lloyd, D^r Mailla, Rachel, who has intermarried with John Trafford, and William Nevins Dorsey. They are all adults except William Nevins Dorsey who is a minor. Nicholas J. Dorsey resides in Indiana. Rachel Trafford and her husband reside in New Jersey. The rest reside in Maryland. To the 4th Interrogatory, I do know the condition of the personal estate of Lloyd Dorsey, It will not be sufficient to pay his debts. To the last Interrogatory, I know nothing further. To the Additional Interrogatory, I am the administrator of the personal estate of D^r Lloyd Dorsey, I have seen him write, I look at the signature to the paper here shown me marked Exhibit N^o 1. The signature thereto is in the hand writing of D^r Lloyd Dorsey. Ezra Honck a witness of lawful age produced on the part of the Complainant being duly sworn and examined to interrogatories filed with me by the Complainant's Solicitor and herewith returned deposes and says, To the first Special Interrogatory I am guardian for Franklin Myers, He is nine years of age. To the 2^d Interrogatory, I look at the paper now shown me marked Exhibit No 3. The money therein mentioned was loaned by me as guardian of Franklin Myers, to D^r Lloyd Dorsey. The amount of the principal now due is two thousand dollars with interest from the first day of March 1856, up to which time the interest has been paid. The Complainant's Solicitor has filed with me papers marked Exhibits N^o 1, 2, 3 & 4 are herewith returned, there being no other witnesses to be examined, and the parties not desiring further time for the production of evidence, I closed the said Commission and herewith return the same under my hand and seal this 2nd day of December 1856,

{ N^o 2693 Equity, in the Circuit Court for Frederick
County as a Court of Equity. This cause stands ready
for a hearing and being submitted, the Bill, Answers,
Exhibits and all other proceedings were by the Court
read and considered. It is thereupon this second day

of January in the year eighteen hundred and fifty seven by Madison Nelson, Circuit Judge for the third Judicial Circuit of the State of Maryland, and by the Authority of the Circuit Court for Frederick County as a Court of Equity, ordered, adjudged and decreed that the real estate mentioned in these proceedings be sold, and that George Smith of Frederick County be and is hereby appointed Trustee to make such sale and that the course and manner of his proceeding shall be as follows. He shall first file in the Office of the Clerk of this Court, a bond to the State of Maryland executed by himself with a surety or sureties to be approved by the Court or Clerk thereof in the penalty of ten thousand dollars conditioned for the faithful performance of the trust reposed in him by this decree or which may be reposed in him by any future order or decree in the premises. He shall then proceed to make sale of the said real estate, having first given at least three weeks previous notice inserted in some newspaper printed in Frederick and such other notice as he may think proper, of the time, place and manner and terms of sale, which terms shall be as follows, one half to be paid in cash on the day of sale or ratification thereof by the Court, at the election of the purchaser, the residue in one year from the day of sale, the purchaser or purchasers giving his, her or their note for the same with approved security and bearing
