And as in duty bound your orator will ever pray &c.

At the request of Adam Dusing the following Deed is recorded 21<sup>st</sup> Dec. 1811.

This Indenture made this third day of December one thousand, eight hundred and eleven between John Colp of Berkeley County and State of Virginia of the one part and Adam Dusing of Frederick County and State of Maryland of the other part. Witnesseth that the said John Colp for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars Current Money of the United States to him in hand paid by the said Adam Dusing before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof he the said John Colp doth hereby acknowledge and from every part and parcel thereof doth hereby acquit, exonerate and discharge the said Adam Dusing his heirs, executors and administrators he the said John Colp hath granted, bargained, sold, aliened, enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents doth grant, bargain, sell, alien, enfeoff & confirm unto the said Adam Dusing his heirs and assigns all the two following tracts or parcels of land lying and being in Frederick County aforesaid being part of a tract of land called "Stainesbaugh" beginning at the bounded tree the original beginning & running thence South ten degrees East one hundred perches, South twenty degrees West six perches, then North eighty degrees West thirty eight perches, North eight degrees West ninety nine and a half perches, then with a straight line to the beginning containing twenty three acres and three quarter acre of land more or less. Also all that tract of land called "Chesnut Sevell" containing twenty five acres more or less together with all & singular the buildings, improvements, hereditaments & appurtenances whatsoever thereunto belonging in any
