Maryland, set. By Frederick County Court Oct^r Term 1846 Whereas; it appears to the Court,
that Isaac Dufung of said County, on the 14th day of March 1846 petitioned Geo. Bowles by one
of the Justices of the Orphan's Court of said County, for the benefit of the Act of Assembly, entitled
"An Act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, passed at November session, 1805, and the
several supplements thereto, and was duly discharged from arrest by the said George Bowles
that the said Isaac Dufung gave notice to his creditors, as required by law, to be and appear
in this Court on the 4th Monday of Oct 1846 to shew cause, if any they have, why the said
Isaac Dufung should not have the benefit of the Act of Assembly and Supplements aforesaid
