the same after paying the expences he is to pay over to my wife Catharine, and it is also my will that my wife shall have what fire wood she may want off the said property but that she is not to cut, or cause any timber to be cut on the said property, during her natural life, and after her death, I give and bequeath all my real property to my brother George Loukenland and Christiana Catharine Loukenland, and David Loukenland, in the following manner, that is to say my brother George Loukenland is to have the one third, and the remaining one third is to be equally divided between my three nephews, Jacob, Andrew and David Loukenland, share & share alike, And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my dear friend, Joseph Mellet to be sole Executor of this my last will and testament, revoking & annulling all former wills by me heretofore made, ratifying and confirming this, and none other to be my last will & testament, In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twenty first day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty four.
