 Benjamin Biggs, Jr. et. al }  
 The object of the Complainants bill in this case is to obtain a decree for the sale of a part of the Real Estate of which Benjamin Biggs, late of said County died seized and the owner, which remains unsold, situate partly in Frederick County, and partly in Carroll County, for the benefit of the complainants and defendants who now own and hold the same as tenants in Common. The Bill charges that Benjamin Biggs late of Frederick County, departed this life some time in the year 1823 leaving a widow, and the following named children his only heirs at law, to wit, Neoma Biggs, Zachens Biggs, Elizabeth Biggs, Benjamin Biggs Junr, William Biggs, Amanda Biggs and Susanna Biggs; that the said Benjamin Biggs died intestate leaving a large and valuable real estate, then, in the County of Frederick, that eighty five acres & 2/3 of an acre of said land was laid off as the widows right
