I, George Williard of Frederick County in the State of Maryland, being feeble in health, but of sound & disposing mind memory and understanding do make, publish & declare this my last will & testament, hereby revoking & annulling all former wills by me made & ordaining this to be my only true last will & testament. - I will & devise that my Executors hereinafter named have my body decently interred. - It is my will & desire that as soon as may be after my death, my Executors proceed to pay my funeral expenses and all my just debts. -

Item - I give devise & bequeath to my beloved wife Susannah Williard for and during her natural life, the House & lot in Jefferson purchased by me from Dr Lloyd Dorsey, together with the use during her natural life of all the furniture & household stuff which may be in said house at the time of my death. - It is my will & desire that my two single daughters Susannah & Ann Coley live with their mother, as long as they respectively remain single & take care of her & in every way minister to her comfort. - Further for the better support of my said wife, I give devise & bequeath to her during her natural life, one third part of all the rest of my property, real personal & mixed, which remain after payment of debts and funeral expenses. - I also give & bequeath to my said wife, my Barouche and the harness thereto belonging for her own use, - further I enjoin & charge it on my Executors to furnish to my said wife, at her residence during her life, a sufficiency of firewood. - After the death of my said wife, I give and
