In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 11th day of April 1845.

Whereas J. George Williard of Frederick County have made & duly executed my last will & testament in writing bearing date the 11th day of April 1845, which said last will & testament & every thing therein contained, I do hereby ratify & confirm (except such parts as are hereby changed) & being desirous to alter & add thereto, do therefore hereby make this my Codicil, which I direct shall be taken as part of my said will, in manner and form following that is to say - that is to say - I hereby give & bequeath to my son George J. Williard, my negro Virginia, the oldest child of negro Sarah, hereinbefore bequeathed to my son Henry Williard. All other children of said negro Sarah, that shall be living at the time of my death, with her future increase, I give & bequeath to my son Henry. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 26th day of August 1848.
