


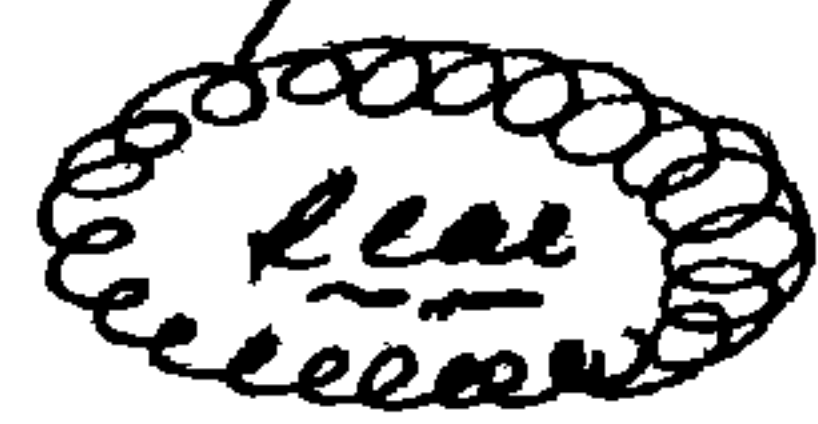
negroes, slaves for life, the property of said Joseph Bartzendafner, to wit, Hamelton, Ephraim, Ann, Ruth, Hester, Henny, Mangella, Rutha, Levy, Mary, Columbus and all the children of Ann, and all the children of Ruth, whose names are not known, and all the other slaves of said Joseph Bartzendafner whose names are not herein specified - also fifteen head of Horses and colts, seven head of mule & cows, one Bull and two calves, fifty head of Hogs, at the Mountain Mills, all the farming utensils now owned and possessed by said Joseph Bartzendafner, one set of Blacksmith tools, Warehouse on the Canal, thirty hives of bees, baronche and harness, and crops now growing on the lands hereby conveyed - Provided that if the said Joseph Bartzendafner shall indemnify and save harmless the said Joseph Eastday from all loss, costs, suits and damage which he may sustain as security in the hereinbefore recited notes and single bills, and as endorser on the hereinbefore recited drafts - and provided that the said Joseph Bartzendafner shall pay the above recited notes, single bills, & drafts at maturity when required, and shall pay the notes and single bills above recited now due on or before the first of October 1857, then this mortgage to be void - Provided that if default shall be made in the payment of the notes, single bills and drafts, hereinbefore recited when due, as to the notes, single bills and drafts not due at the date of this instrument - and as to the notes, single bills and drafts due at this date upon the nonpayment of the same, by the said Joseph Bartzendafner to the holder or obligees thereof, when payment shall be demanded and required by the said holder or obligees thereof, then it shall and may be lawful for the said Joseph Eastday to enter upon the said real estate. Exhibit No 5 to Bill This Mortgage made the fifteenth day of September in the year 1857, Witnesseth that in consideration of the sum of Eight hundred and forty six dollars, with interest from this date, due by Joseph Bartzendafner to Martin W E House - and also to indemnify the said Martin W E House as surety for said Joseph Bartzendafner in a single bill executed by said Joseph Bartzendafner and said Martin W E House, to George Richards for the sum of One thousand dollars, and dated on the 18th day of May in the year 1856, payable twelve months after date, with interest
