In the name of God Amen, I, Adam Sorrenty of Frederick County and State of Maryland, being in perfect health of body and of sound and disposing mind memory and understanding, considering the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the time thereof, feeling desirous to adjust my worldly affairs and thereby be the better prepared to leave this world when it shall please God to call me hence, do therefore make and publish this my last will and testament, in manner & form following - First and principally I commit my soul to Almighty God that gave it, and my body to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors and after my debts and funeral charges are paid, I devise and bequeath in manner following viz: - In summe, I give and bequeath unto my dearly beloved wife, all and singular my real and personal property owned by me at my decease, to have and to hold the same, at her will and pleasure and for her own use so long as she shall live together with full privilege to make or cause to be made all necessary repairs that may be wanting from time to time, as regards the House, Stabling or fencing during her life, and I further will that she my beloved wife shall have full power to use all the personal, including Cash on hand, if any, together with all notes promissory or cash accounts, at her will and pleasure - and when by her so used, she shall not in any way be compelled to render an account for such use by her made, of any of the personal bequeathed to her in this my last will and testament - Nevertheless the real property herein bequeathed unto my beloved wife, she shall have no privilege right or power to dispose of the whole nor any part thereof under any pretence, situation or circumstance. - Item To my daughter Elizabeth wife of Walter Filipo, I will five dollars, to be paid out of my estate after the decease of my beloved wife, when a distribution shall be made, and no more, my reason for not willing her any more, is formed on the strictest Justice towards her and the rest of my legal representatives - Item To my son John, for whom I still retain the most affectionate paternal feelings yet cannot render him any aid by way of devise for reasons well understood by the devisee and the devisee whose reciprocal feelings are warm and natural to him, I will ten dollars and no more, to be paid him out of my estate after the decease of my beloved wife, when a distribution shall take place, his unfortunate case has been a source of much grief and often roused those sympathetic feelings the heart is so very susceptible of - Item - It is my will that after the decease of my beloved wife, all the estate, real and personal, then remaining, shall be divided in manner following, Viz: To my son Henry and to my son William, I will Two hundred dollars, each respectively - this sum I will to them Henry and William, to balance outfits which their sisters received at their marriage,
