Know all men by these presents that we Henry Lorentz and John Safford of Frederick County State of Maryland are held + firmly bound unto the state of Maryland in the full and just sum of \$2000 to be paid to the state of Maryland or its certain attorney to which payment well and truly to be made and done we bind ourselves and each of us our and each of our heirs executors and administrators jointly + severally firmly by these presents sealed with our seals and dated this 17 day of December in the year 1857. Whereas by a decree of the Circuit Court for Frederick County as a Court of Equity dated on the 12 day December 1857 and passed in a cause in said Court wherein Hugh McAleer is complainant and Philip McGaughran is defendant the above bound Henry Lorentz has been appointed trustee to sell certain real estate in the proceedings in said cause mentioned. Now the condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound Henry Lorentz shall well and faithfully perform the trust reposed in him by said decree or that may be reposed in him by any future decree or order in the premises then the above obligation to be void otherwise to be and remain in full force and virtue in Law
