To the Honorable Madam Nelson Circuit Judge for the Third
 Judicial Circuit of the State of Maryland sitting in the Circuit Court for
 Bill Frederick County as a Court of Equity
 The Bill of Complaint of Pety Gollinger Reuben G. Gollinger Mary G.
 Gollinger Sarah G. Gollinger Amy G. Gollinger and Cassandra Gollinger
 of Frederick County State of Maryland respectfully sheweth that a certain
 John Gollinger late of Frederick County dec^d died intestate in or about
 the year 1849 seized and possessed of a tract or parcel of land called
 "Egler's Quarry" containing 200 acres of land more or less situate in the
 County and State aforesaid as will be seen by a Copy of the deed herewith
 exhibited marked exhibit N^o 1 which your Complainants pray together
 with all other exhibits herein after produced may be taken and
 considered as a part of this their Bill of Complaint. And your
 Complainants charge that the said John Gollinger left a widow
 surviving named Cleora Gollinger and also left the following children
 by her at law to wit Pety Gollinger Reuben G. Gollinger Mary G.
 Gollinger Sarah G. Gollinger Amy G. Gollinger and Cassandra Gollinger all of
 whom are adults and reside in Frederick County and Lem Gollinger
 Julianna Gollinger and John A. Gollinger who are infants under the age
 of 21 years and reside in Frederick County State of Maryland
 Thus your Complainants further charge that the said land is not
 susceptible of partition among the heirs at law of the said John Gollinger
 deceased and that the interest of all parties concerned infants as well as
 adults require that the said lands should be sold under a decree of the
 Court and the proceeds of sale distributed among the parties interested
 therein. Your Complainants further state that as the adult
 heirs of said John Gollinger they have agreed to sell said lands at
 private sale to William Harbaugh and that Cleora Gollinger as
 actual guardian of the infant heirs has also agreed to make such sale
 and has agreed that the Honorable Court may pass a decree for the
 sale of said lands at private sale and that your Complainants the
 only adult heirs of said John Gollinger have consented that a decree for
 a sale may be passed by the Court they naming all right to a
