Gollinger Juliana Gollinger and John Gollinger of Frederick County Complainants and they to appear in this Court at such certain day to be therein named to answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree as may be passed therein and as in duty brought

This Indenture made the 10th day of August 1818 Between Peter Gollinger of Frederick County state of Maryland, of the one part + John Gollinger of the same County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Peter Gollinger for and in consideration of the sum of \$4000 current money to him on hand paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge and himself therewith to be fully satisfied and paid Both granted bargain and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain sell convey enfeoff + confirm unto the said John Gollinger his heirs executors + assigns forever all that tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County aforesaid called Peter Run and contained in the following metes and bounds beginning at a stone now planted at the original beginning of the whole tract called Bayard + running thence S 86^o 22' ps to a heap of stones N 20^o ps to a heap of stones N 58^o 63' ps to a stone heap N 41^o 25' ps to a mile stone planted in the middle of the divisional line between Maryland and Pennsylvania then up an equal line S 89^o 1/2' N 50' ps to a stone planted at the end of the second line of the present original part of Bayard stile with said line S 89^o 1/2' N 72' ps to a stone heap at the end of 30' ps on the 8th line of Bayard aforesaid stile with the state line S 89^o 1/2' N 120' ps to a stone heap then bearing it S 20^o N 30' ps to a stone heap S 67^o 21' ps to a stone heap S 25^o N 74' ps to a stone heap S 53^o 23' ps to a heap of stones at the end of the 7th line of the original then with the 8th line thereof S 53^o 26 1/2' ps to a stone heap at the end of 23' ps on the 14th line of a tract of land called the Resurvey on Zealanda granted John Beruda May 28th 1767 for 380 acres then with said land two courses N 40^o 217' ps to a stone heap S 53^o 218' ps to a stone heap at the end of four ps on the 6th line of that original tract of land called grazing ground on which Barbara was a resurvey then with said land the five following courses S 41^o N 116' ps to a stone heap S 45^o 200' ps to a stone heap N 55^o 2626' ps to a stone heap N 67^o 224' ps

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
