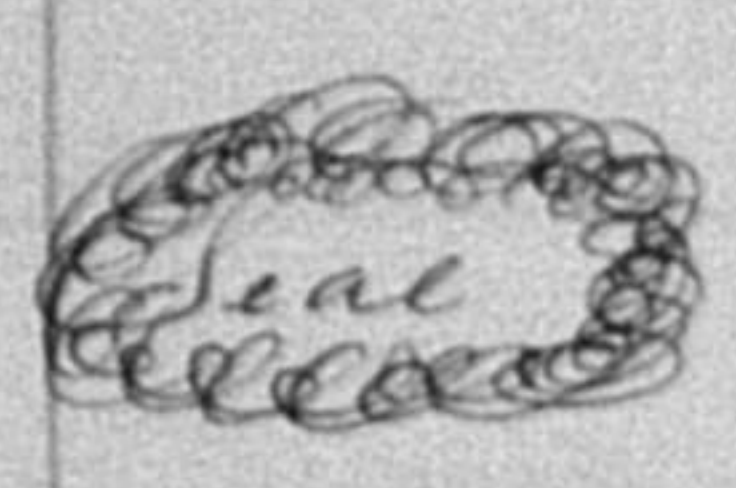

At the request of W^m Eagle the following deed was recorded October 24 1833.
 This Indenture made this 26th day of October in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and thirty three, Between Frederick A. Schley of Frederick County in the State of Maryland of the one part, and William Eagle of the County and State aforesaid of the other part, whereas by a decree of the Frederick County Court, sitting as a Court of Equity bearing date the fourth day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine, the above named Frederick A. Schley was appointed a Trustee and authorized and empowered to sell and dispose of the real estate of Mary Ann Read, late of Frederick County, deceased, for the payment of her debts, that in pursuance of the said decree, the said Frederick A. Schley did, on the fifth day of December in the year 1829, sell and dispose of, to the above named William Eagle part of a tract of land called "New Bremen," and part of a tract called "Cumberland" and a tract called "Addition to Cumberland" at and for the sum of two thousand nine hundred and six dollars and fifteen cents current money, and whereas the purchase money for said parts of said tracts of land and said tract of land & premises hath been fully paid and satisfied and the said Frederick A. Schley is authorized by the said decree to execute a conveyance for the same, and to comply with the terms of said decree, the said Frederick A. Schley hath agreed to execute these presents, Now this Indenture Witnesseth, that the said Frederick A. Schley in consideration of the above recited premises and also of one dollar current money of the United States, to him in hand paid by the said William Eagle, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged and him self therewith to be paid, hath granted, bargained, sold, aliened and confirmed, and by these presents doth grant, bargain, sell, alien and confirm unto the said William Eagle his heirs and assigns forever, all that lot or parcel of land, situated, lying and being in the County and State aforesaid, being part of a tract of land called "New Bremen" and containing one hundred and twenty acres more or less, being the same land which was conveyed to Dorcas Howard by a certain Jo. M. Cromwell of the County and State aforesaid, as will more fully and at large appear by reference to a deed recorded on the third day of December in the year 1817, in Liber J. S. No 5 folios 854, 855 and 856, One of the Land Records of Frederick County, And also all those parts of a tract of land called "New Bremen" containing ninety eight acres more or less, a tract of land called "Cumberland" containing twenty five acres more or less, and a tract of land called "Addition to Cumberland," containing twenty two and a half acres more or less, being the same land conveyed by a certain Jean S. Pigman of the County and State aforesaid, to Dorcas Howard by a deed of conveyance bearing date, the 16th day of February in the year 1819, all of which will more fully and at large appear by reference to said deed of conveyance recorded on the the twenty third day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and nineteen, in Liber J. S. No 8 folios 198 & 199 One of the Land Records of Frederick County. I have and to hold the said lands so as above described and premises, with every of the appurtenances unto the said William Eagle his-
