



At the request of Mr. Eagle the following Deed is recorded May 8 1824 viz
This Indenture made this 15th day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hun-
dred and twenty four, Between Thomas W. Morgan, Sheriff of Frederick County in the State
of Maryland of the one part and William Eagle of Loudon in the State of Virginia of
the other part, Witnesseth, whereas on the 20th day of February 1824, a certain writ of the
State of Maryland of fieri facias did issue forth out of Frederick County Court aforesaid to
the Sheriff of Frederick County aforesaid directed, commanding him the said Sheriff, that
of the goods and chattels, lands and tenements of Samuel Roland, Robert G. McPherson and
William Langwill being in his bailiwick, he should cause to be made and levied as well
the sum of two hundred and seven dollars and seventy nine cents current money, a certain damages
and costs for which they confessed judgment to Clement J. Hilleary before George Rohr and
John S. McCully Gentlemen, Justices of the peace of our said County, on the 11th day of September
1823, whereof they they are convict as of a supersedas filed and entered of Record in the County
Court of our said County, to us it appears, and one dollar, eleven and two thirds cents additional
costs, which sums of money and costs the said Sheriff was commanded that he should have
before the judges of the next County Court to be held at Frederick Town in and for said
County on the first Monday of March then next, to render unto the said Clement the damages
and costs so as aforesaid confessed or acknowledged with all additional costs and that
the said Sheriff should also have then and there that writ, and whereas also the said writ
came to the hands of the said Sheriff and in pursuance of the Commands therein contained
the said Sheriff laid the same upon all the right, title, interest and estate of said Sam-
uel Roland of, in, and to the Potomac Island, Situate, lying and being in Frederick
County and State of Maryland which were heretofore devised to Dade Roland, Samuel
Roland and Lloyd Roland by a certain Thomas Roland by last will and testament duly
executed and recorded in the Office of the Register of Wills of Frederick County reference
being thereto had will more fully appear, And whereas after due notice being given
