In the matter of George W. Eagle a Lunatic } No 3050 Equity, Circuit Court for Frederick County, in Equity.

The foregoing Petition and the inquisition returned in this cause whereby it is found that George William Eagle is of unsound mind and incapable of the government of himself his lands tenements, goods and chattels being read and considered. It is thereupon this 16th day of October 1862, by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, as a Court of Equity, ordered that the inquisition as returned be ratified and that William G. Cole of Frederick County, State of Maryland, be and he is hereby appointed trustee of the person and estate of said George William Eagle, That before proceeding to act, he shall first file with the Clerk of this Court a bond to the State of Maryland, in the penalty of six thousand dollars with one or more surties, to be approved by this Court or the Clerk thereof with condition for the faithful discharge of his duty as Trustee, and to deliver up the property of said Lunatic whenever he may be required by this Court and to render an account of all
