At the request of Mary Welty the following Deed is recorded Sept 22 1847. This indenture made 25th day of March 1847. Between John S. Welty of Frederick County in the State of Maryland of the one part and Mary Welty of the Same County and State of the other part. Witnesseth that the said John S. Welty for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars current money to him in hand paid by the said Mary Welty, before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof the said John S. Welty doth hereby acknowledge and thereby fully satisfied content and paid, hath granted, bargained, sold, released, enfeoffed and confirmed, and by these presents doth grant bargain, sell, release, enfeoff and confirm unto the said Mary Welty, her heirs and assigns All his right, title and interest whatsoever, that the said John S. Welty now hath or ever had, of in and to a certain plantation or tract of land that Caspar Welty by his deed bearing date, the 9th day of January 1828, conveyed to Elizabeth Welty, Mary Welty, William Welty, Sarah Welty, Cath^e Welty Susan Welty, John Jeremiah Welty and Elias Welty, for the lands therein described, situated lying and being in the County and State aforesaid, and recorded May 5 1828 in Liber L.S. No. 29 folios 419 & 420 One of the Land Records of Frederick County reference being thereunto had, will more fully, and at large appear. To have and to hold the said right, title and interest of him the said John S. Welty of, in and to the said lands and premises so as aforesaid described, to her the said Mary Welty her heirs & assigns forever, and to and for no other use, intent or purpose whatsoever, against him the said John S. Welty and his heirs and against all and every other person or persons whatsoever, claiming, or to claim any right or title, in, and to the same, or any part thereof, by from or under him, or his heirs shall & will warrant and defend the same by these presents. - In witness whereof the said John S. Welty hath here unto subscribed his name and affix his seal the day and year first herein before written.
