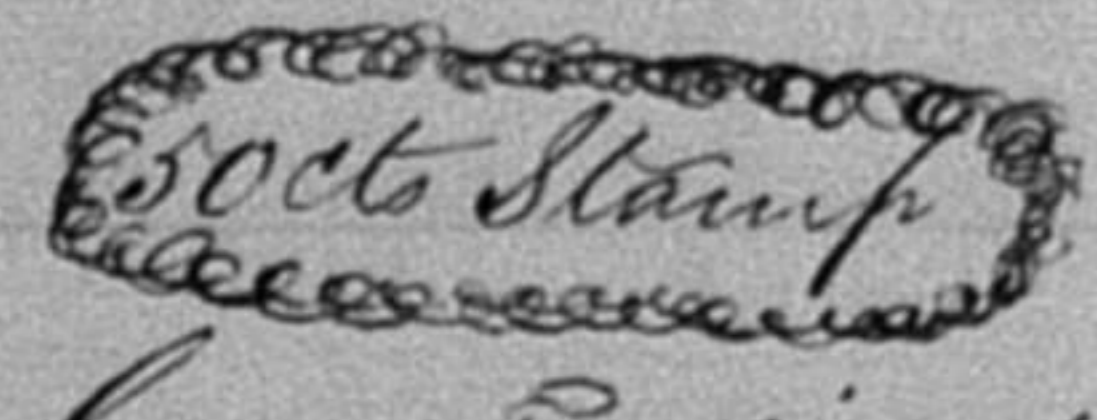

To the Honorable Madison Nelson Judge of the Circuit Court for Frederick County sitting as a Court of Equity.

The bill of Complaint of Edward J. Rice of said County respectfully sheweth unto your Honor that on the nineteenth day of October in the year eighteen hundred and fifty nine a certain Richard J. Johnson, then of said County was indebted unto your Orator in the sum of two thousand five hundred and fifty eight dollars and twelve cents upon and by his three several promissory notes bearing date the day and year aforesaid, each being for the separate sum of eight hundred and fifty two dollars and seventy and two thirds cents and payable in one, two and three years after the date thereof respectively, with interest from date payable annually and that to secure the payment of said sums of money in said three promissory notes specified, with all legal interest thereon, the said Richard J. Johnson & Elizabeth J. Johnson his wife, by their joint deed bearing date the day and year first aforesaid and duly executed and acknowledged, conveyed to your Orator all those pieces or parts of tracts of land
