In the Circuit Court for Frederick County sitting in Equity.

The object of this suit is to procure a decree for the sale of certain mortgaged premises in Frederick County, which were on the nineteenth day of October in the year eighteen hundred and fifty nine mortgaged by said Richard J. Johnson to said Edward J. Rice. The bill states that on the 19th day of October 1859 the said Richard J. Johnson conveyed certain real estate which is particularly described in the bill and the accompanying Exhibit unto said Edward J. Rice by way of mortgage to secure the payment of the sum of twenty five hundred and fifty eight dollars and twelve cents with interest from the said date, which was due from said defendant to said Complainant upon three promissory notes dated the day and year aforesaid and payable one, two and three years after date respectively, each for the sum of eight hundred and fifty two dollars and seventy and two thirds cents with interest - that said defendant paid the first of said notes with the interest thereon and the interest on the other two notes for one year - that the sum of seventeen hundred and five dollars and forty one and two thirds cents specified in the other two notes with interest from 19th October 1860 is due and unpaid and that said Richard J. Johnson resides out of the State of Maryland.

It is thereupon this 18th day of December 1862 ordered that the Complainant by causing a copy of this order to be inserted in some newspaper printed in Frederick once in each of four successive weeks before the 25th day of January 1863 give notice to the said absent defendant of the object and substance of this bill and warn him to appear in this Court in person or by Solicitor on or before the 26th day of April 1863 to answer the premises and show cause if any he have, why a decree should not pass as prayed. -
