Last Will and testament of John Smith of Adams.

I John Smith of A. now living in the vicinity of Ladysburg being old and feeble of body, but yet of perfectly sound mind and judgment, considering the certainty of death, and the uncertainty of the time thereof, and being the better prepared to leave this world by making a Will, do hereby make and publish this my last Will and testament, hereby revoking and making void all former Wills by me at time heretofore at any made, and first I direct my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gives it, and my body to be decently buried in the ground, and my funeral be conducted in a manner corresponding with my Estate and situation in life. And as to such worldly Estate as it has pleased God to intrust me with, I dispose of the same as follows:-

First - I direct that all my debts and funeral Expenses to be paid as soon as convenient after my decease out of first moneys that shall come in the hands of my Executor from any portion of my Estate. then first I give and bequeath my personal property as follows. -

First - I give and bequeath to Samuel Coleman my large gun. -

Second - I give and bequeath unto William Coleman my watch and Pistol. - Third

I give and bequeath unto John Coleman my small gun. - Fourth - I give and bequeath

unto Jacob Coleman, Samuel Coleman, William Coleman, John Coleman, my bed,

and all my labouring Tools such as Grain Cradles, Grass Scythes, Axes, maces and

wedges & all the balance of my personal prabe to be equally and justly divided

among them share and share alike as they may see proper, - Further I direct that Jacob

Coleman is to pay no rent for the time which he has been living on my property, and

by paying my debts and funeral Expenses, - I give and bequeath unto him the said

Jacob Coleman and Mary Coleman his wife a life Estate in my real property so that

they may live on it rent free, or take the rents and profits of said real Estate to their

own use and benefit during their natural life - and after the death of said Jacob

Coleman and Mary Coleman his wife - I direct that then this real Estate is to be sold

and the proceeds of it to be equally divided among all said Coleman's Executors -

Samuel Coleman, Rachel Coleman, William Coleman, John Coleman & Catharine

Margaret Coleman, all to have share and share alike. - And I do also hereby direct

that if any of the aforesaid parties herein mentioned as heirs shall have died between

the time of my decease and the time of the distribution herein ordered, then the heirs

or representatives of the aforesaid heirs shall be entitled to such shares as their res-

pective ancestors would have been entitled to receive if then living. -

And lastly I do hereby make and ordain my esteemed Neighbour Wm Bowman Executor

of this my last will and testament. -

In Witness whereof I John Smith of A. the testator have to this my Will, written on

this sheet of paper set my hand and seal this 16th day of April in the year of our

Lord One thousand Eight hundred and fifty four. -
