Interrogatories to be proposed to witnesses to be produced on the part of the Complainant.

- 1st Are you or not acquainted with the parties to this suit or either and which of them? If you know long have you known them and each of them?
- 2^d Were you or not acquainted with one Benjamin D Boyer formerly a resident of Frederick County? Is he dead or alive. If dead when and where did he die?
- 3^d Did or did not the said Benjamin D Boyer leave children? If yes, state how many and their sexes names, ages and present places of residence?
- 4th Look at the papers now shown you marked Exhibit No 1 No 2 was or was not Benjamin D Boyer the owner of the property described in said Exhibit at the time of his death, if you state all your knowledge herein.
- 5th Did or did not Benjamin D Boyer die testate or intestate, state all your knowledge herein.
- 6th Are or are you not administrator of the personal Estate of Benjamin D Boyer of you. Look at Exhibit No 2 now shown you, and state whether or no any part of the money intended to be secured therein has been paid by B D Boyer in his lifetime or by you as his administrator since his death state fully all your knowledge herein.

Testimony

At the Execution of the annexed Commission issued out of the Circuit Court for Frederick County and to me directed and empowering me to examine Evidences in the cause therein depending wherein Jacob Willard is Complainant and Migouri Boyer and John Boyer are defendants, J. Williams B Nelson Commissioner therein named, did on the 5th day of August in the year Eighteen hundred and sixty three, at my office in Frederick City, Maryland, proceed to take the following depositions, to wit:

There being no witnesses present to be examined and the Complainant desiring further time for the production of his Evidences the said Commissioner adjourned the said Commission to the 18th day of August Eighteen hundred and sixty three, at which time and at my office aforesaid I proceeded to take the following depositions, to wit:

Daniel Boyer, a witness of lawful age, produced on the part of the Complainant, being duly sworn and examined to interrogatories filed with the Commissioner by the Complainant and herewith returned deposes and says:

In the first Int: - That he is acquainted with all the parties to this suit and has known them for some years - that the defendants are his grand children.

In the 2^d Int: - That he knew Benjamin D Boyer - that he was deponents son - that he is dead - that he died on the 23rd day of January 1863 in Frederick County, Maryland.

In the 3^d Int: - That Benjamin D Boyer left two children, a son and a daughter - that the daughter's name is Migouri, aged about five years and the son's name John, aged about three years and that both daughter and son reside in Haines District Frederick County.

In the 4th Int: - That he looks at the papers now shown him marked Exhibit No 1 & Exhibit No 2 - that Benjamin D Boyer was the owner of the property described in said Exhibits that he the said Benjamin D Boyer lived and died in the occupancy of the said property.

In the 5th Int: - That said Benjamin D Boyer died intestate. In the 6th Int: - That deponent is administrator on the Estate of Benjamin D Boyer dec. - that no part
