To the Hon. Madison Nelson Circuit Judge of the third judicial Circuit of the State of Maryland sitting in the Circuit Court for Frederick County as a Court of Equity.

The petition of Daniel Boyer administrator of Benjamin P. Boyer late of Frederick County decd. humbly shews to your Honor, that the said Benjamin P. Boyer died intestate some time in the month of January 1863, that your petitioner was appointed administrator by the Orphans Court of Frederick County, and that he has settled his final account and has over paid the assets of said Estate in the sum of three hundred and twenty five dollars and fifty cents which will fully and at large appear by reference to a certified copy of the final account herewith Exhibited, marked Exhibit No 1 which your petitioner prays together with all other Exhibits may be taken as part of this his petition.

Your petitioner further states that a bill of Complaint was filed in your Honorable Court known as No 3099 Equity in said Court for the purpose of foreclosing a mortgage given by the said Benjamin P. Boyer to a certain Jacob Willard that a decree was passed in said Court, and the real Estate mentioned in said proceedings sold - and the funds are now in Court for distribution. Your petitioner further states that the personal Estate of the said deceased was totally insufficient to pay his debts and that the proceeds of the sale of his mortgaged real Estate sold under the decree passed in said Court No 3099 Equity was more than sufficient to pay the mortgaged debt thereon. Your petitioner further states that the said Benjamin P. Boyer died intestate as aforesaid leaving two children his heirs at law Migouri Boyer and John Boyer that both reside in Frederick County State of Maryland and both are infants under the age of twenty one years.
